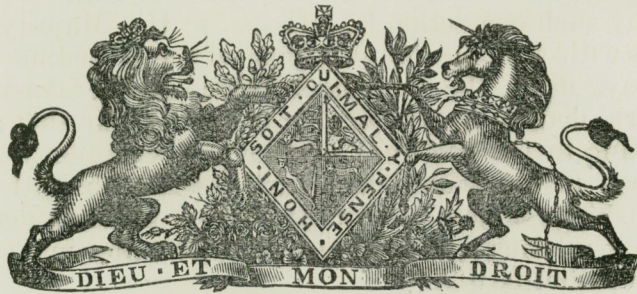

Act No. 18, 1901.

An Act to consolidate the Acts relating to the prohibition of Net-fishing in Port Hacking. [Assented to, 4th October, 1901.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Net-fishing (Port Hacking) Title. Act, 1901."

2. (1) The Acts mentioned in the Schedule are hereby repealed. Repeal.

(2) Every notification and all regulations made or published Saving. under the Acts hereby repealed, and being in force at the time of the passing of this Act, shall be deemed to have been made or published hereunder.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in any Act relating to fisheries, or any license granted or proclamation issued under any such Act, no person shall cast or set any net, of any kind whatsoever, in any place westward of a straight line drawn from the north to the south head of the inlet in the county of Cumberland known as Port Hacking, for the purpose of catching or adapted to catch or capable of catching fish, and whether within the waters of the said inlet subject to or beyond the influence of the tide. Prohibition of net-fishing. 50 Vic. No. 6, s. 1.

Any person who casts or sets any net contrary to the provisions of this Act shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds for the first offence, and to a penalty not less than five pounds nor more than Penalty.

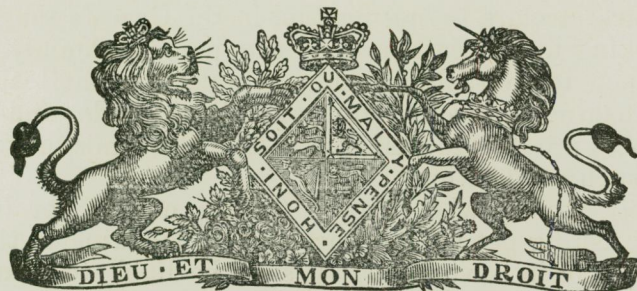

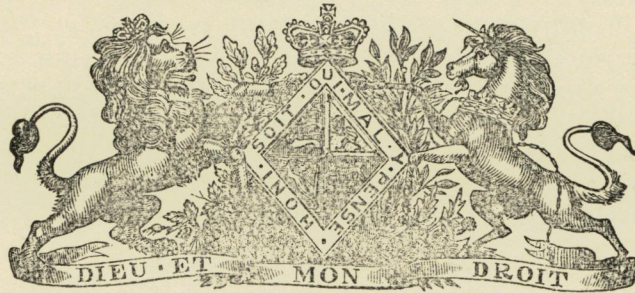
