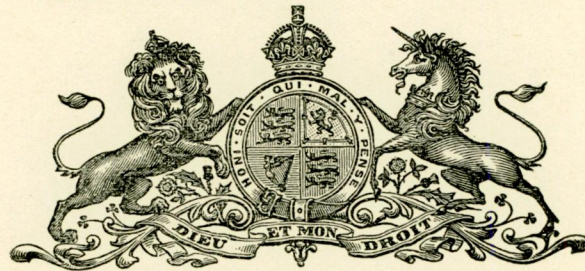

Act No. , 1902.

An Act to secure the payment of Sheriff's fees.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 **1.** This Act may be cited as the "Sheriff (Amendment) Short title.
Act, 1902."

10 **2.** Where, in respect of the service or execution of any process, fees would be chargeable under the Sheriff Act, 1900, there shall be deposited in the Sheriff's office, to answer such fees, an amount estimated by the Sheriff as the probable amount of such fees; and service or execution of such process shall not proceed unless such amount is first deposited.

Act No. 1902

AN ACT to provide for the payment of interest on the public debt.

Enacted by His Majesty the King in Council, that the following provisions shall have effect as if they were enacted by His Majesty in Council:

- 1. The amount of the interest on the public debt shall be paid out of the Consolidated Revenue Account.
- 2. Where in respect of the interest on the public debt any provision of any law is inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, that provision shall nevertheless continue to have effect.
