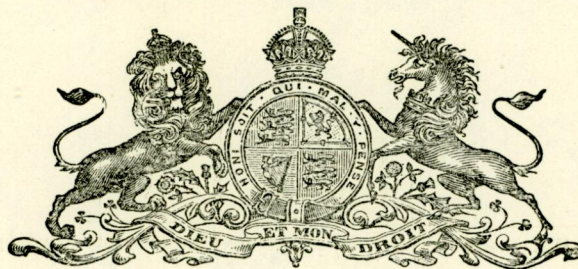

An Act to consolidate the enactments relating to the Sydney Mint. [Assented to, 20th August, 1902.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 1. This Act may be cited as the "Sydney Mint Act, 1902." Short title.
- 2. The Act twenty-eighth Victoria number three is hereby Repeal.
repealed.
- 3. There shall be payable to His Majesty in every year out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund sums not exceeding in the whole in any year the sum of fifteen thousand pounds for defraying the salaries, contingencies, retiring and other allowances connected with the Sydney branch of the Royal Mint. 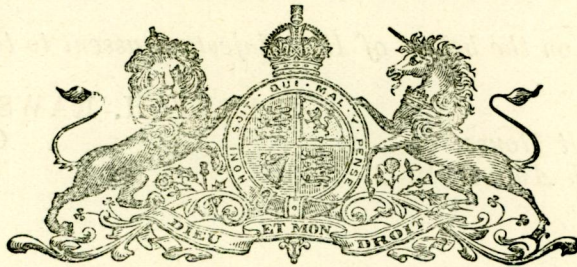

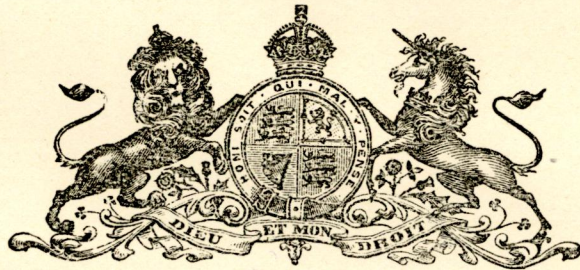
