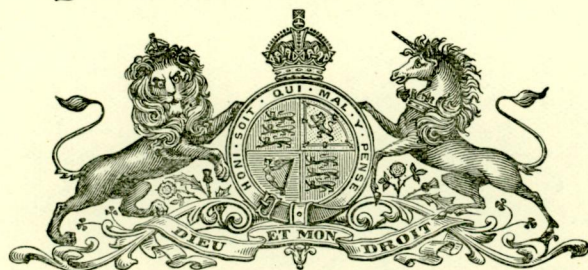

Act No. , 1905.

An Act to provide that no pensions shall be paid to Judges to be appointed to the Supreme Court or District Court Bench; to amend the Constitution Act, 1902, the Supreme Court and Circuit Courts Act, 1900, and the District Courts Act, 1901; and for other purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 **1.** This Act may be cited as the “Judges’ Pensions Abolition Short title. and Duties Act, 1905.”

10 **2.** Notwithstanding anything in the Constitution Act, 1902, the Pensions of Judges. Supreme Court and Circuit Courts Act, 1900, the District Courts Act, 1901, no pension shall be paid to any Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, or Puisne Judge of the said Court, or District Court Judge, appointed after the commencement of this Act.
