Act No. 23, 1906.

An Act to regulate the driving of certain stock through public streets and places of the city of Sydney; to amend the Sydney Abattoir and Nuisances Prevention Act, 1902; and for other purposes. [Assented to, 11th December, 1906.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Sydney Stock-driving Act, Short title.

1906."

2. Section fifteen of the Sydney Abattoir and Nuisances Amendment of s. 15 Prevention Act, 1902, is amended by the addition of the following of Act No. 37, 1902

proviso:-

"Provided that sheep, calves, and pigs intended for sale, slaughter, or shipment may be driven through or along rertain prescribed public streets or places within the said city between the hours of eight in the evening and eight in the morning."

The said section is also amended by the addition of the following

subsection to be read as subsection two of that section:—

"(2) The Governor may make regulations prescribing the Regulations. public streets and places through or along which such sheep, calves, and pigs may be driven, and in such regulations may impose a penalty not exceeding ten pounds for any breach thereof."
