An Act to provide for the incorporation of certain companies in so far as respects the public or joint liability to amount the banks and Bank of India Act, 1858, and the Banks and Bank of India Act, 1881, and for other purposes connected therewith, passed in 1886.

Enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by authority of the same, as follows:—

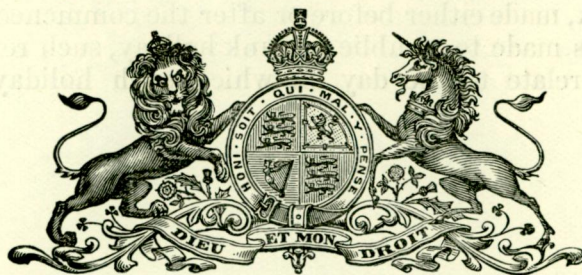
