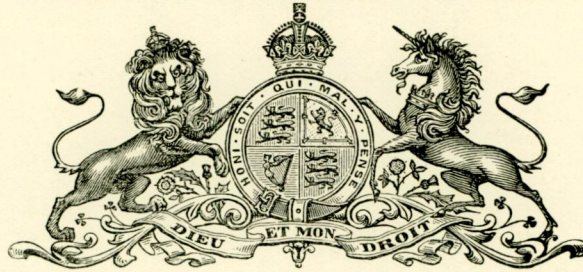

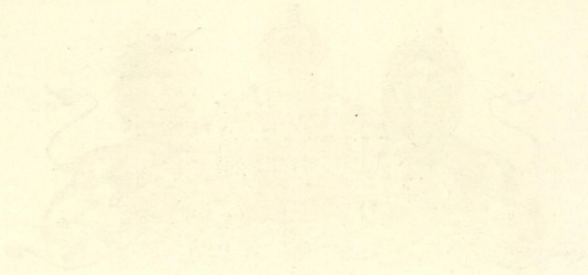

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Hyde, Cook, and Phillip Parks Act, 1904," and shall take effect on and after the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and five. Short title and commencement

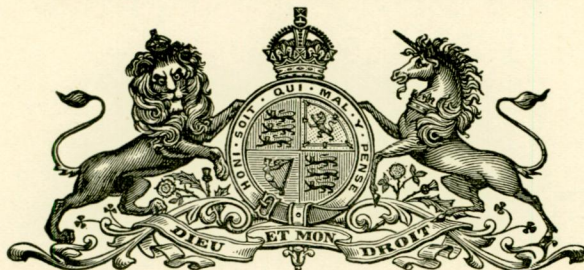

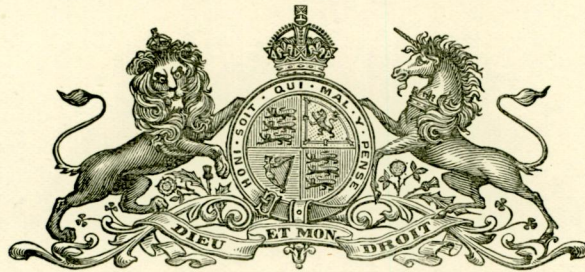
