# EDWARDI VII REGIS.

Act No. 38, 1906.

An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain Sums to make good the Supplies granted for the Service of the year from the 1st day of July, 1906, to the 30th day of June, 1907, inclusive of both dates; to adjust the vote "Advance to Treasurer, 1905-1906," for supplementary charges during the period from 1st July, 1905, to 30th June, 1906, inclusive of both dates; to provide for Public Works and other Services for the year 1906-7 out of the Public Works Fund, and for services of the year 1906-7 out of the Closer Settlement Fund; and for purposes connected with and incidental to the above objects. [Assented to, 17th December, 1906.]

WHEREAS we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, Preamble. the Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, have granted to Your Majesty the several sums hereinafter mentioned for the service of the year from the first day

day of July, one thousand nine hundred and six, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and seven (inclusive of both dates), and for supplementing the grants made by the present Parliament, in its Second Session, in adjustment of the vote "Advance to Treasurer, 1905-1906," for charges during the period from the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and five, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and six (inclusive of both dates), to be provided for out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, and on account of Public Works and other Services for the year one thousand nine hundred and six and one thousand nine hundred and seven, to be provided for out of the Public Works Fund, and out of the Closer Settlement Fund: And whereas we desire to make good out of the said Funds the several sums granted to Your Majesty as aforesaid: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the State of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—
