An Act to amend the law relating to fees in respect of proceedings before justices; to enable the Governor to fix such fees; and for other purposes in connection therewith. [Assented to, 25th November, 1904.]

B^E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :--

1. This Act shall commence and have effect on a day to be short title. appointed by the Governor by proclamation in the Gazette, and may be cited as the "Justices (Fees) Act, 1904."

2. The enactments and Schedules mentioned in the Schedule Repeal. hereto shall, to the extent thereby indicated, be repealed.
