Act No. 32, 1904.

An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain Sums to make good the Supplies granted for the Service of the year from the 1st day of July, 1904, to the 30th day of June, 1905, inclusive of both dates; to adjust the vote "Advance to Treasurer, 1903-1904," for supplementary charges during the period from 1st July, 1903, to 30th June, 1904, inclusive of both dates; and for purposes connected with and incidental to the above objects. [Assented to, 21st December, 1904.]

WHEREAS we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, Preamble. the Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, have granted to Your Majesty the several sums hereinafter mentioned for the service of the year from the first

day of July, one thousand nine hundred and four, to the thirtieth day of June, of the year one thousand nine hundred and five (inclusive of both dates), and for supplementing the grants made by the last Parliament, in its Third Session, and in adjustment of the vote "Advance to Treasurer, 1903–1904," for charges during the period from the first day of July, of the year one thousand nine hundred and three, to the thirtieth day of June, of the year one thousand nine hundred and four (inclusive of both dates): And whereas we desire to make good out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales the several sums granted to Your Majesty as aforesaid: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the State of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, that out of the said Consolidated Revenue Fund there shall be appropriated, and are hereby appropriated, and shall be issued and applied for or towards the several uses and purposes hereafter expressed—

FOR THE SERVICE OF THE YEAR FROM FIRST JULY, 1904, TO THIRTIETH JUNE, 1905.

The Treasurer of the said State shall issue and pay the Treasurer shall pay said several sums to such persons for the purposes hereinbefore by warrant or order. mentioned in such manner and in such proportions as the Governor by any warrant or order in writing under his hand and directed to the said Treasurer shall from time to time order and direct, and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the said State; but the said Treasurer shall not be held liable for any claims which may arise in connection with any of the State Departments transferred to the Commonwealth on or after the date of such transfer.

An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain Sums to make good the Supplies granted for the Service of the year from the 1st day of July, 1904, to the 30th day of June, 1905, inclusive of both dates; to adjust the vote "Advance to Treasurer, 1903-1904," for supplementary charges during the period from 1st July, 1903, to 30th June, 1904, inclusive of both dates; and for purposes connected with and incidental to the above objects.

WHEREAS we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, Preamble. the Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, have granted to Your Majesty the several sums hereinafter mentioned for the service of the year from the first day

XII. The Treasurer of the said State shall issue and pay the Treasurer shall pay said several sums to such persons for the purposes hereinbefore by warrant or order. mentioned in such manner and in such proportions as the Governor by any warrant or order in writing under his hand and directed to the said Treasurer shall from time to time order and direct, and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the said State; but the said Treasurer shall not be held liable for any claims which may arise in connection with any of the State Departments transferred to the Commonwealth on or after the date of such transfer.

XIII. The said Treasurer shall in his Accounts from time to Treasurer shall be time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in allowed credit for pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid, and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said Accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.
