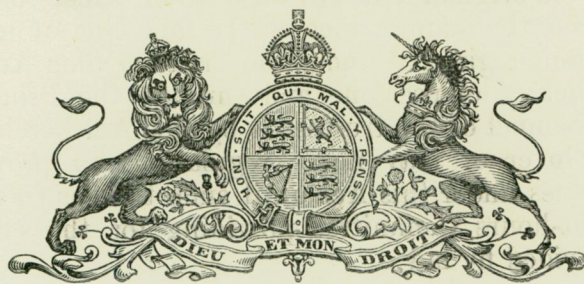

Act No. 27, 1905.

An Act to amend the Newcastle Friendly Societies and Trades Hall Site Act, 56 Victoria, No. 35; to provide for the election of trustees under the Newcastle Eight-hours Committee Rules; and for other purposes incidental thereto. [Assented to, 2nd December, 1905.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Newcastle Friendly Societies and Trades Hall Site Act Amendment Act of 1905," and shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and six.

2. All the estate, right, title, and interest to the land described in Schedule B of the Principal Act is hereby vested in six trustees to be Election of trustees and maintaining of trades hall.

And the said land shall be vested in the said trustees from time to time without the necessity for any conveyance or assignment whatsoever, and the trustees for the time being shall administer the provisions of the Principal Act as though they had been the original trustees until their successors be elected, and shall continue the maintenance on the said land of a hall for the use of trade unions registered under the Trades Union Act, 1881.

**3.** So much of clauses one and three of the Principal Act as refers to the personnel of the trustees is by this Act hereby repealed.

**4.** The Governor may make regulations to provide for the election of trustees under this Act until such time as the rules of the Newcastle Eight-hours Committee providing for the same are duly approved as provided by law.

**BE** it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Newcastle Friendly Societies and Trades Hall Site Act Amendment Act of 1905," and shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and six. Short title.

2. All the estate, right, title, and interest to the land described in Schedule B of the Principal Act is hereby vested in six trustees to be Election of trustees and maintaining of trades hall.

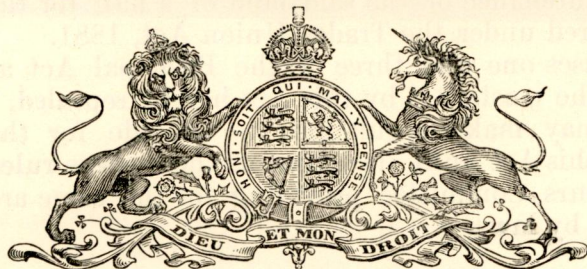

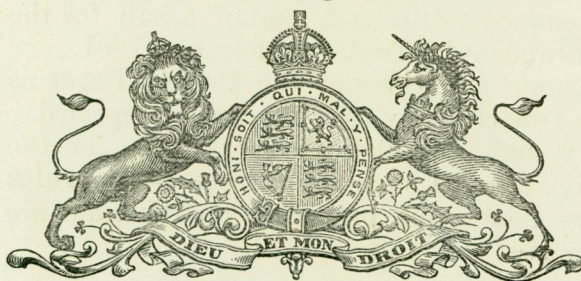

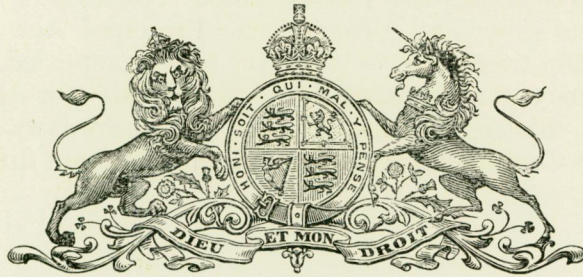
