Act No. 13, 1905.

An Act to enable the Railway Commissioners of New South Wales to construct, purchase, or lease motor omnibuses, and to run the same on certain roads; and for other purposes connected therewith or incidental thereto. [Assented to, 6th September, 1905.]

B^E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :---


1. This Act may be cited as the "Government Motor Omnibus Short title. Act, 1905," and shall be read with the Government Railways Act, 1901, the provisions of which shall, as far as possible, apply to this Act.

2. The Railway Commissioners of New South Wales may Commissioners may construct, purchase, or lease motor omnibuses, and may run such runmotor omnibuses. omnibuses on those roads which may be approved by the Governor.

3. The provisions of any Act for the regulation of traffic, except Statutory traffic so far as they relate to the regulation and licensing of public vehicles, regulations to apply. shall apply to such motor omnibuses.

Government Motor Omnibus.

2. The Railway Commissioners of New South Wales may Commissioners may construct, purchase, or lease motor omnibuses, and may run such construct, &c., and omnibuses on those roads in the State of New South Wales, which may be approved by the Governor.

3. The provisions of any Act relating to the regulating or such omnipuses need licensing of vehicles shall not apply to such motor omnibuses, except not be licensed. as regards the speed at which such omnibuses may be driven, and the observance of the rule of the road.


3. The provisions of any Act for the regulation of traffic, Statutory Traffic 10 except so far as they relate to the regulation and licensing of public Regulations to vehicles, shall apply to such motor omnibuses.
