Act No. 22, 1904.

An Act to amend the Navigation Act of 1901, by providing for issue of regulations. [Assented to, 10th December, 1904.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Navigation Amendment Short title. (Regulations) Act, 1904," and shall be read as one with the Navigation Act, 1901, hereinafter called the Principal Act.

2. The Governor may make all regulations necessary to carry Regulations. out the provisions of the Principal Act.

This Public Bill originated in the Legislative Assembly, and, having this day passed, is now ready for presentation to the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL for its concurrence.

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1. This Act may be cited as the "Navigation Amendment short title. (Regulations) Act, 1904," and shall be read as one with the Navigation Act, 1901, hereinafter called the Principal Act.

2. Subject to the provisions of the Sydney Harbour Trust Act, Regulations. 1900, The Governor may make harbour regulations to have effect at any 10 port-within-the-jurisdiction, and may also make all regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of the Principal Act.


