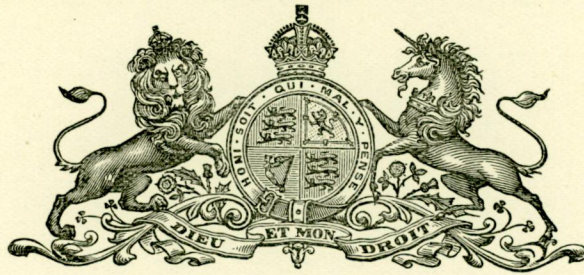

Act No. 12, 1906.

An Act to abolish fees in primary and superior public schools ; to amend the Public Instruction Act of 1880 ; and for other purposes incidental thereto. [Assented to, 5th October, 1906.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Free Education Act, Short title. 1906," and shall be construed with the Public Instruction Act of 1880, hereinafter called the Principal Act.

(2) This Act shall come into operation on the Monday Commencement. immediately following the day on which it receives the Royal assent.

2. On and after the coming into operation of this Act, education Education in primary and superior public schools in primary and superior public schools shall be free, and no fees shall be chargeable for the same, and section eleven of the Principal Act is to be free. hereby repealed accordingly, and section twenty-seven of the same Act is amended by the omission of the words "and for the higher classes in superior public schools."

Act No. 13, 1908

An Act to amend the Public Health Act of 1907 and for other purposes, in relation to the Public Health Act of 1907.

1. The Act shall be amended by striking out the word "and" after the word "and" in the first section of the Act of 1907, and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "or".

2. The Act shall be amended by striking out the word "and" after the word "and" in the second section of the Act of 1907, and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "or".

3. The Act shall be amended by striking out the word "and" after the word "and" in the third section of the Act of 1907, and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "or".

4. The Act shall be amended by striking out the word "and" after the word "and" in the fourth section of the Act of 1907, and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "or".

5. The Act shall be amended by striking out the word "and" after the word "and" in the fifth section of the Act of 1907, and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "or".

6. The Act shall be amended by striking out the word "and" after the word "and" in the sixth section of the Act of 1907, and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "or".

7. The Act shall be amended by striking out the word "and" after the word "and" in the seventh section of the Act of 1907, and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "or".

8. The Act shall be amended by striking out the word "and" after the word "and" in the eighth section of the Act of 1907, and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "or".

9. The Act shall be amended by striking out the word "and" after the word "and" in the ninth section of the Act of 1907, and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "or".

10. The Act shall be amended by striking out the word "and" after the word "and" in the tenth section of the Act of 1907, and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "or".

11. The Act shall be amended by striking out the word "and" after the word "and" in the eleventh section of the Act of 1907, and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "or".

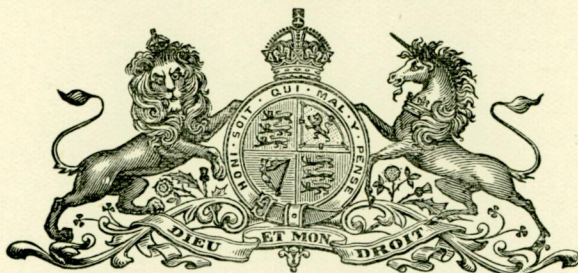
12. The Act shall be amended by striking out the word "and" after the word "and" in the twelfth section of the Act of 1907, and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "or".

Education in primary and superior public schools to be free.

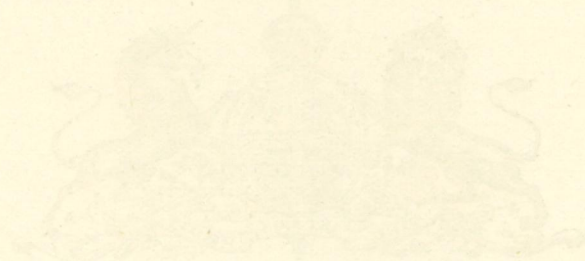

EDWARD VII REGIS

Act No. 12, 1908

An Act to abolish tax in primary and superior public schools; to amend the Public Instruction Act of 1904; and for other purposes incidental thereto. Enacted on 25th October, 1908.

It is enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the Cape of Good Hope, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Education Act, 1908, and shall be construed with the Public Instruction Act of 1904, hereinafter called the Principal Act.

(2) This Act shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1909, or on such other day as may be appointed by the Governor in that behalf.

2. On and after the coming into operation of this Act, no tax shall be levied on the owners of the land on which any primary and superior public schools shall be situated, and no rates shall be levied for the same, and section seven of the Principal Act is hereby repealed accordingly, and section twenty-seven of the same Act is amended by the insertion of the words "and for the higher classes in superior public schools."

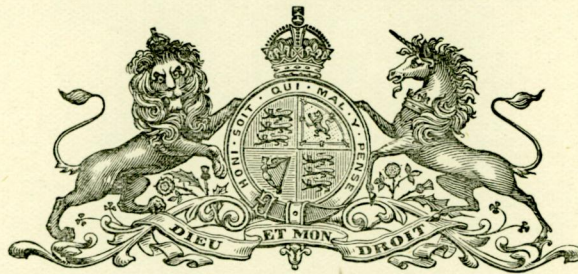
