

An Act to apply certain sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales towards the Services of the Year 1905-1906; and for Services to be hereafter provided for by Loan. [Assented to, 29th July, 1905.]

WHEREAS we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects Preamble. the Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, have resolved to grant to Your Majesty the sum of One million six hundred and seventy-seven thousand four hundred and sixty are provided that is to seventy-seven.

hundred and sixty-one pounds, that is to say—

The sum of One million one hundred and eighty-five thousand pounds, being the sum required to defray the expenses of the various Departments and Services of the State during the months of August and September or following month of the financial year ending thirtieth June, one thousand nine hundred and six. The sum of Four hundred and ninety-two thousand four hundred and sixty-one pounds for the Services set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed:

And whereas we desire to make good out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales the sum so granted to His Majesty: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales there shall and may be issued and applied for or towards making good the supply so resolved to be granted to His Majesty for the said several Services, the sum of One million six hundred and seventy-seven thousand four hundred and sixty-one pounds, of which the sum of One million one hundred and eighty-five thousand pounds is to be expended at the rates which have been sanctioned for the financial year ended thirtieth June, one thousand nine hundred and five, subject to the rate of any reduction that may hereafter be made in the expenditure of the year 1905–1906, and Four hundred and ninety-two thousand four hundred and sixty-one pounds for the Services specified in the Schedule hereto annexed.

Treasurer to pay under Governor's Warrant or Order. 2. The Treasurer shall issue and pay the said sums for the Services aforesaid in such manner and in such proportions as the Governor, by Warrants or Orders in writing under his hand, and directed to the said Treasurer, shall from time to time order and direct. And the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and paid out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the State.

Treasurer to have credit and receipts to discharge him.

3. The Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for all sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such Warrants or Orders. And the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be full and valid discharges to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for such sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain Sums to make good the Supplies granted for the Service of the year from the 1st day of July, 1905, to the 30th day of June, 1906, inclusive of both dates; to adjust the vote "Advance to Treasurer, 1904-1905," for supplementary charges during the period from 1st July, 1904, to 30th June, 1905, inclusive of both dates; to adjust the Votes "Advance to Treasurer" 1903-4 and previous years for supplementary charges during the period 1st January, 1893, to 30th June, 1904, inclusive of both dates; and for purposes connected with and incidental to the above objects. [Assented to, 8th December, 1905.]

XIII. An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain Sums to make good the Supplies granted for the Service of the year from the 1st day of July, 1905, to the 30th day of June, 1906, inclusive of both dates; to adjust the vote "Advance to Treasurer, 1904-1905," for supplementary charges during the period from 1st July, 1904, to 30th June, 1905, inclusive of both dates; to adjust the Votes "Advance to Treasurer" 1903-4 and previous years for supplementary charges during the period 1st January, 1893, to 30th June, 1904, inclusive of both dates; and for purposes connected with and incidental to the above objects.

WHEREAS we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, Presemble. the Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, have granted to Your Majesty the several sums hereinafter mentioned for the service of the year from the first day

XIII. The Treasurer of the said State shall issue and pay the Treasurer shall pay said several sums to such persons for the purposes hereinbefore by warrant or order. mentioned in such manner and in such proportions as the Governor by any warrant or order in writing under his hand and directed to the said Treasurer shall from time to time order and direct, and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the said State; but the said Treasurer shall not be held liable for any claims which may arise in connection with any of the State Departments transferred to the Commonwealth on or after the date of such transfer.

XIV. The said Treasurer shall in his Accounts from time to Treasurer shall be time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in allowed credit for moneys paid by him. pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid, and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said Accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

XV. This Act may be cited as the "Appropriation Act of Short title. 1905-1906."
