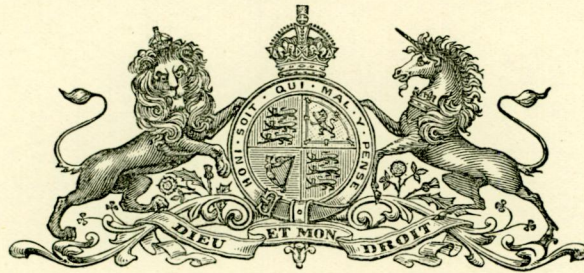

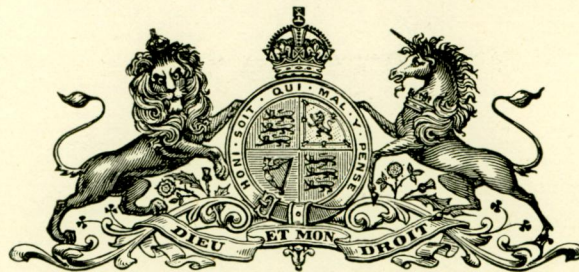
1. The Act may be cited as the Patent Act, 1901.  
2. Section 1 of the Patent Act, 1900, is amended by the addition of the words "in the case of an invention which is a new invention" at the end of the first line of the section.  
3. The amendments made by this Act shall be deemed to have taken effect as from the 1st day of January, 1901.

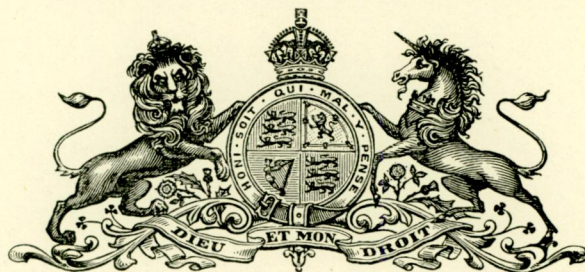
