BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with
the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative
Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the
authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Gaming (Amendment) Act, 1905."

2. The games called respectively far-ou and bak-ou are hereby
declared to be unlawful games.

3. Any person who sells any kind of object or share in any
lottery or chance, in any such game shall be guilty of an offence
under subsection two of section four of the Gaming Act, 1902, and
shall be deemed a rogue and vagabond within the meaning of the said
Act.
