An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain Sums to make good the Supplies granted for the Service of the year from the 1st day of July, 1907, to the 30th day of June, 1908, inclusive of both dates; to adjust the vote "Advance to Treasurer, Consolidated Revenue Fund, 1906-1907," for supplementary charges during the period from 1st July, 1906, to 30th June, 1907, inclusive of both dates; to provide for Public Works and other Services out of the Public Works Fund; to adjust the vote "Advance to Treasurer, Public Works Fund, 1906-7," for supplementary charges during the period from 1st July, 1906, to 30th June, 1907, inclusive of both dates; and to provide for services out of the Closer Settlement Fund; and for purposes connected with and incidental to the above objects. [Assented to, 20th December, 1907.

WHEREAS

An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain Sums to make good the Supplies granted for the Service of the year from the 1st day of July, 1907, to the 30th day of June, 1908, inclusive of both dates; to adjust the vote "Advance to Treasurer, Consolidated Revenue Fund, 1906-1907," for supplementary charges during the period from 1st July, 1906, to 30th June, 1907, inclusive of both dates; to provide for Public Works and other Services out of the Public Works Fund; to adjust the vote "Advance to Treasurer, Public Works Fund, 1906-7," for supplementary charges during the period from 1st July, 1906, to 30th June, 1907, inclusive of both dates; and to provide for services out of the Closer Settlement Fund; and for purposes connected with and incidental to the above objects.
