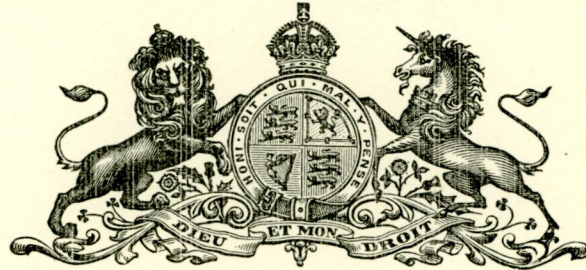

Act No. , 1907.

An Act to create the office of Minister for Agriculture ; to establish a Department of Agriculture ; and for other purposes.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

5 1. This Act may be cited as the " Department of Agriculture Short title. Act, 1907."

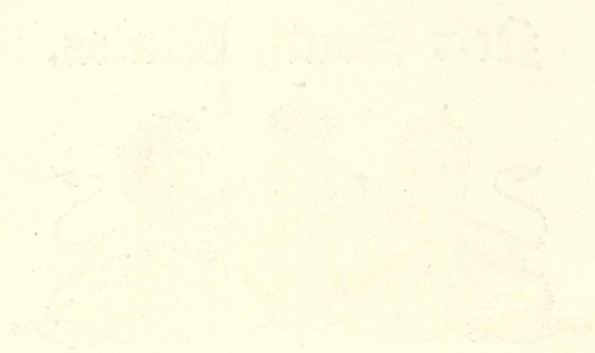
10 2. The Governor may, by proclamation in the Gazette, create the office of Minister of Agriculture. The said office shall be an office of profit under the Crown, created by Act of Parliament as an office of the Executive Government. Establishing of office of Minister of Agriculture.

 3. The Minister of Agriculture shall be a responsible Minister of the Crown, having management and control of the Department of Agriculture, which the Governor is hereby empowered to establish. Management of Department of Agriculture.

STATE OF ILLINOIS

Act No. 107

An Act to create the office of State Auditor and to provide for the election of a State Auditor, and for other purposes.

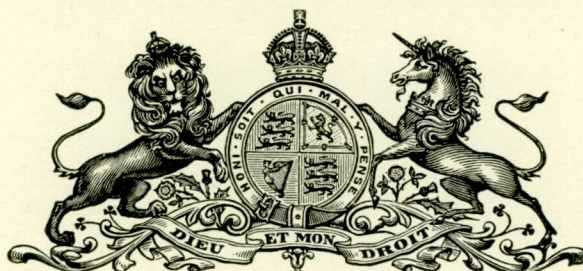
Section 1. There shall be a State Auditor, who shall hold office for a term of four years, beginning on the 1st day of January next following the expiration of the term of the State Auditor then in office, and until his successor is elected and qualified.

Section 2. The State Auditor shall be elected by the people of the State at the general election held in the year 1908, and in every fourth year thereafter.

Section 3. The State Auditor shall have the honor of the rank of Major-General in the Army of the United States, and shall be entitled to the same precedence as is accorded to Major-Generals in the Army of the United States.

Section 4. The State Auditor shall be a member of the Board of State's Officers, and shall have the same powers and duties as are conferred upon the members of that Board by the provisions of the Act to amend the Constitution of the State of Illinois, approved March 27, 1900.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, in connection with the advice and consent of the Privy Council, that the Legislative Assembly of New Zealand shall in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the King, enact as follows:—

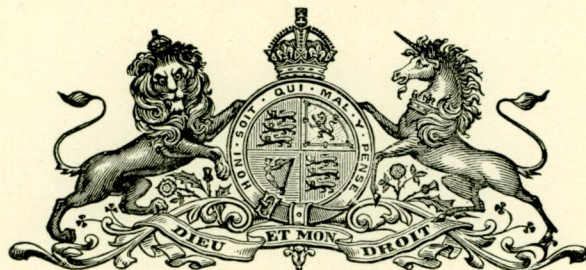
1. This Act may be cited as the "Department of Agriculture Act, 1907."
2. The Governor may by proclamation in the Gazette create the office of Minister of Agriculture, and he shall be an officer of honor under the name inserted in Act of Parliament as an officer of the Executive Government.
3. The Minister of Agriculture shall be responsible to the House of Representatives for the management and control of the Department of Agriculture, which the Governor is authorized to establish.

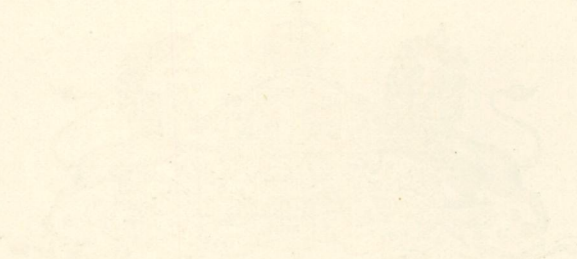

Act No. 1907

An Act to provide for the better administration of the South Islands, and for other purposes. [Enacted on 19th December, 1907.]
