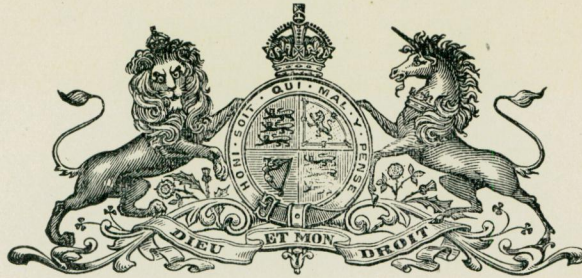

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Grass-tree Licenses Act, Short title. 1908."

2. The Minister may issue special licenses to confer upon the holders thereof the right to cut or obtain and remove the common grass-tree (xanthorrhœa) on or from timber reserves, forest reserves, or Crown lands not under lease or license, unless with the consent of the lessee or licensee, or any specified areas thereof, upon such terms and conditions and subject to the payment of such fees or royalties and for such period as the Minister may think fit.

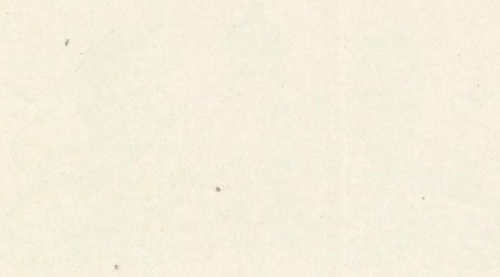
The Minister may cancel or suspend any such license for any reason he may think fit.

3. The Governor may make regulations to carry this Act into effect.

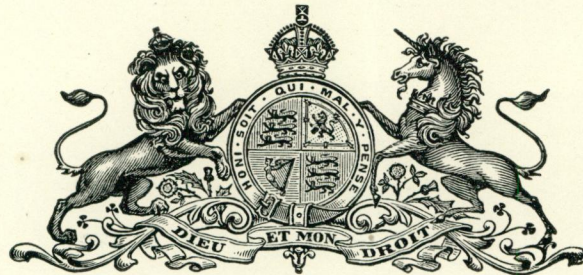

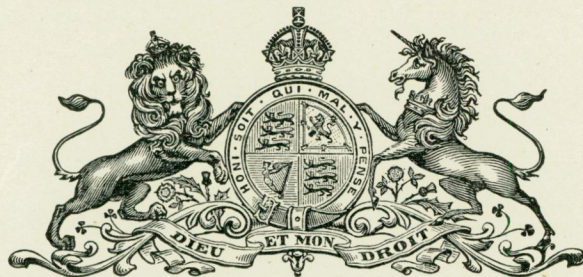
