Act No. 11, 1909.

An Act to sanction the extension of Newcastle Northern Breakwater; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Assented to, 7th December, 1909.]

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the Public Preamble. Works Act, 1900, the Legislative Assembly did, by resolution, declare that it was expedient to carry out a certain work, namely, extending the Northern Breakwater at Newcastle Harbour entrance: And whereas, on the passing of the said resolution, a statutory duty was by the said Act imposed on the Secretary for Public Works to introduce a Bill into the said Assembly to sanction the carrying out of the said work: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Newcastle Northern short title. Breakwater Extension Act, 1909." 2.

Newcastle Northern Breakwater Extension.

Work sanctioned.

2. The carrying out of the work, more particularly described in the Schedule to this Act, is hereby sanctioned, and the Secretary for Public Works, or the member of the Executive Council for the time being performing the duties of the said Secretary, is hereby authorised to undertake and carry out the said work, subject to the provisions of this Act, and for that purpose shall be, and shall have the powers and duties of, a "Constructing Authority" within the meaning of the Public Works Act, 1900.

Plan of work.

3. The plan of the said works is the plan marked "Newcastle Harbour, Extension of Northern Breakwater," signed by the Secretary for Public Works, and countersigned by the Chief Engineer for Harbours and Water Supply, and deposited in the public office of the said Secretary.

Cost, and how defrayed.

4. The cost of carrying out the said works, estimated at thirty-four thousand seven hundred and fifty pounds, may be defrayed from such Loan Votes as are now, or may hereafter be, applicable to that purpose, or from appropriations of the Public Works Fund, or partly from such votes and partly from the said appropriations, and shall not under any circumstances exceed the estimated cost by more than ten per centum.

SCHEDULE.

The construction of an extension of the existing northern breakwater beyond its present termination for a distance of four hundred and twenty feet seawards, marked "Extension of Northern Breakwater" on plan aforesaid.
