An Act to provide that certain deductions from superannuation allowances under the Act No. 55 of 1899, shall, under certain circumstances, cease to be made ; and for purposes consequent thereon and incidental thereto. [Assented to, 16th November, 1908.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Public Service (Superannuation) Act, 1908." Short title,

- (a) any person who has been employed as an officer in the public service is at the commencement of this Act in the receipt of a superannuation allowance under and by virtue of section two of the Act No. 55 of 1899; and

- (c) the sum of the amounts by which such allowance has from time to time been diminished as aforesaid, has at any time before or after the commencement of this Act equalled the amount of the payments, gratuities, and refunds received as aforesaid,

the superannuation allowance payable to the said person shall thereupon be deemed to have ceased to be diminished as aforesaid.

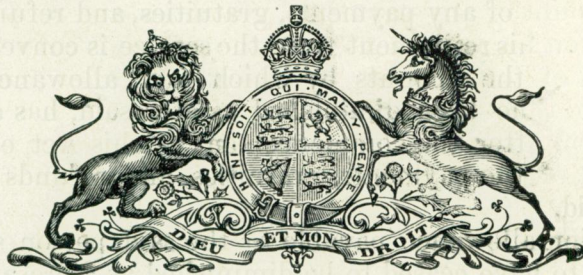

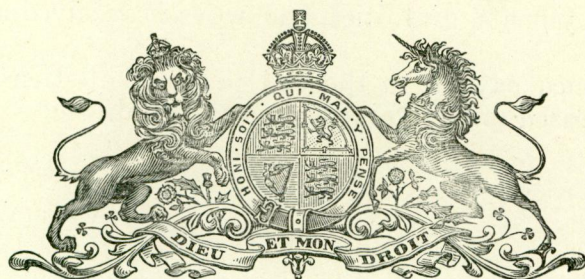
