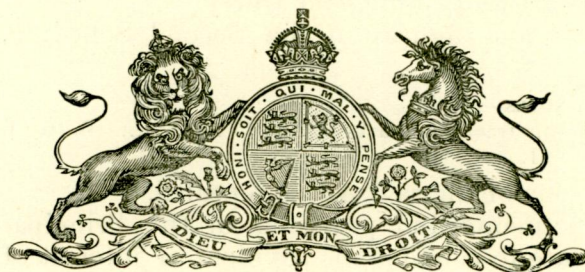

Act No. , 1907.

An Act to repeal the stamp duties on bills of exchange, promissory-notes, drafts, and receipts; to amend the Stamp Duties Act, 1898, and the Stamp Duties (Amendment) Act, 1904; and for other purposes.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 **1.** This Act may be cited as the "Stamp Duties (Amendment) Act, 1907," and shall be construed with the Stamp Duties Act, 1898 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Act), and the Stamp Duties (Amendment) Act, 1904. Short title.

2. This Act shall commence and come into operation on the 10 first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eight. Commencement.

3. (1) The following enactments and provisions of the Principal Act are repealed :— Remission of duty on receipts.

(a) Sections forty-five, forty-six, and forty-seven.

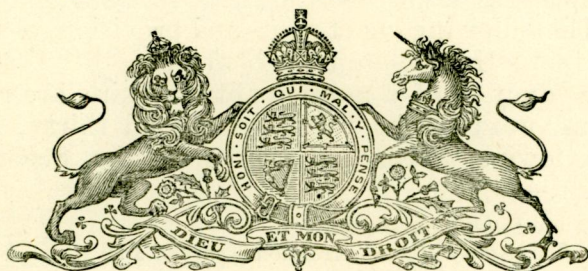

30 **6.** Within six months after the commencement of this Act, any person possessed of any unexecuted forms for receipts, bills of exchange, promissory notes, or drafts payable on demand impressed with uncancelled duty stamps, or possessed of any uncancelled adhesive duty stamps, shall be entitled to a refund of the face value of such stamps, less two and a half per centum of such value, on delivering up such forms and stamps to the Commissioner, and on making application in the manner prescribed. 35 **7.** Nothing in this Act shall affect the annual composition payable upon bank-notes under section twenty-six of the Principal Act. Saving.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Stamp Duties (Amendment) Short title. Act, 1907," and shall be construed with the Stamp Duties Act, 1898 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Act), and the Stamp Duties (Amendment) Act, 1904.

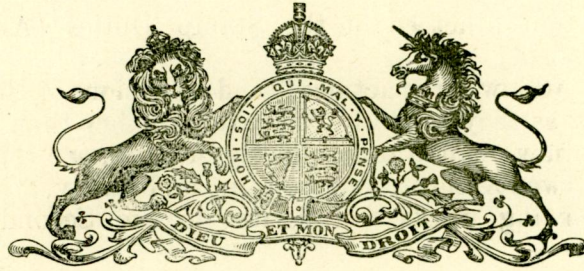
