## Act No. 6, 1908.

An Act to authorise payments in subvention of friendly societies in certain cases; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Assented to, 23rd September, 1908.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Subventions to Friendly Short title. Societies Act, 1908."

2. In this Act—

"Friendly society" means friendly society registered under the Friendly Societies Act of 1899, or under any amendment thereof.

"Applicant society" means a friendly society which makes application for a grant in subvention, in accordance with the provisions of this Act and with the regulations under this Act.

3. (1) The subvention grants under this Act shall be paid out of moneys to be provided by Parliament.

(2) Friendly societies desirous of obtaining the advantages of this Act shall apply for the same through their trustees, in the form to be prescribed by regulation, to the registrar of friendly societies, who shall investigate such claims, and make recommendations thereon to the Minister charged with the administration of this Act.

4. There shall be paid to the trustees of every applicant society by way of subvention-

- (a) one half of the cost to the society in each year for sick-pay, according to its rules, in respect of the period of sickness after twelve months from the commencement of each case of continuous sickness, for all male members less than sixty-five years of age and for all female members less than sixty years of age;
- (b) the whole cost to the society for sick-pay in respect of male members aged sixty-five years and over, and of female members aged sixty years and over :

Provided that the amount payable by the State under this section shall not exceed five shillings for each week of sickness included in any claim made under paragraphs (a) and (b) of this section.

5. There shall be paid annually to the trustees of each applicant society an amount equal to the total contributions chargeable under the rules of the society for the benefits of medical attendance and medicine in respect of male members aged sixty-five years and over, and of female members aged sixty years and over : Provided that the rules of the society shall not charge rates of contribution for such benefits different to those chargeable to members under the ages specified herein.

6. There shall be paid annually to the trustees of each applicant society an amount equal to the total contributions chargeable under the rules of the society to assure the payment of the funeral donations according to its rules in respect of male members aged sixty-five years and over, and of female members aged sixty years and over.

7. The moneys received by trustees of a friendly society under the three last preceding sections shall be paid by them into the respective funds which, according to the rules of the society, are charged with providing the sickness, medical, or funeral benefit of the society or branch, as the case may be, in proportion to the cost of sick-pay, medical, or funeral benefit to such funds respectively upon which the amount of subvention was based. The trustees shall supply, in the form prescribed by regulation, a statement in adjustment in proof of the due performance of the above requirements.

(1) Every person shall be liable to imprisonment for not Penalties. more than six months, with or without hard labour, if by any wilfully false statement as to age, or other matter relative to the grant of any subvention benefit under this Act, he obtains or aids or abets any person to obtain subvention benefit which he would not otherwise have obtained, or of greater amount than he would otherwise have obtained.

(2) In any case where a misstatement has secured to any society or branch a higher subvention than that to which it was entitled, the Colonial Treasurer may reduce the amount of subsequent subvention grants to such extent as he may consider justifiable under the circumstances.

14. If a trustee of a friendly society applies otherwise than in Penalty for the manner authorised by this Act, any moneys being or being part <sup>misapplyingmoneys.</sup> of a subvention grant made to that society under this Act, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.

15. The Governor may make regulations for carrying out the Regulations. intentions of this Act, and may impose any penalty not exceeding fifty pounds for the breach of any such regulations.

16. All penalties under this Act may be imposed by or recovered Recovery of before a stipendiary or police magistrate, or any two justices in petty sessions.

17. The registrar of friendly societies shall be entrusted with Administration by the duties arising out of the administration of this Act, in addition to <sup>registrar.</sup> his functions under the Friendly Societies Act, 1899.

There shall be paid annually to the trustees of each applicant 20 society an amount equal to the total contributions chargeable under the rules of the society to assure the payment of the funeral donations according to its rules in respect of male members aged sixty-five years and over, and of female members aged sixty years and over.

7. The moneys received by trustees of a friendly society under 35 the three last preceding sections shall be paid by them into the respective funds which, according to the rules of the society, are charged with providing the sickness, medical, or funeral benefit of the society or branch, as the case may be, in proportion to the cost of sick-pay, medical, or funeral benefit to such funds respectively upon 40 which the amount of subvention was based. The trustees shall supply, in the form prescribed by regulation, a statement in adjustment in proof of the due performance of the above requirements.

8. The registrar of friendly societies shall tabulate, from the returns sent to him under the provisions of the Friendly Societies' Acts, 45 and shall certify annually, the amount of sickness suffered in each society and branch for which a subvention is payable under this Act.

  - (b) if being a trustee of a friendly society, he misapplies any moneys payable into any fund of that society in terms of this Act.

25 In every such case the proof of the falsity of such statement or the existence of such subvention benefits shall be prima facie evidence of the false statement, or of the attempt to wrongfully procure a grant of a subvention benefit having been wilfully or knowingly made, and the onus of proving that it was made in good faith shall be on the

30 defendant: Provided that in any case where a misstatement has secured to any society or branch a higher subvention than that to which it was entitled, the Colonial Treasurer may reduce the amount of subsequent subvention grants to such extent as he may consider justifiable under the circumstances.
