GEORGII V REGIS.

Act No. 28, 1910.

An Act to sanction the carrying out of a scheme of Sewerage for the districts of Botany and North Botany; and for purposes consequent thereupon or incidental thereto. [Assented to, 22nd December, 1910.]

WHEREAS in accordance with the provisions of the Public Preamble. Works Act, 1900, the Legislative Assembly did by resolution declare that it was expedient to carry out a certain work, namely, the carrying out of a scheme of Sewerage for the districts of Botany and North Botany: And whereas, on the passing of the said resolution, a statutory duty was by the said Act imposed on the Secretary for Public Works to introduce a Bill into the said Assembly to sanction the carrying out of the said work: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of

of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Botany and North Botany Sewerage Act, 1910."

2. (1) The carrying out of the works, more particularly described in the Schedule to this Act, is hereby sanctioned, and the Secretary for Public Works, or the Member of the Executive Council for the time being performing the duties of the said Secretary, is hereby authorised to undertake and carry out the said works, subject to the provisions of this Act, and for that purpose shall be and shall have the powers and duties of a Constructing Authority within the meaning of the Public Works Act, 1900.

(2) The said work is hereby declared to be a work authorised under the Metropolitan Water and Sewerage Acts, 1880–1889.

3. The plan of the said works is the plan marked "Botany and North Botany Sewerage Works," signed by the Secretary for Public Works, and countersigned by the Chief Engineer for Irrigation and Drainage, and deposited in the public office of the said Secretary.

4. The cost of carrying out the said works, estimated at two hundred and twenty thousand two hundred and twenty pounds, may be defrayed from such loan votes as are now, or may hereafter be, applicable to that purpose, and shall not, under any circumstances, exceed the estimated cost by more than ten per centum.

SCHEDULE.

THE construction of sewers, pumping stations, rising mains, and all works incidental thereto and necessary for the sewerage of the districts numbered 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 on the said deposited plan.

The works to be subject to such deviations and modifications, omissions, or extensions as may, from time to time, be deemed necessary by the Constructing Authority.
