An Act to establish a fund for bursaries tenable in secondary schools and in the Sydney University; to constitute a board of control: and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto.

DE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :--

1. This Act may be cited as the "Bursary Endowment Act, short title. 5 1912."

2. There shall be a bursary endowment fund, which shall be Constitution of fund. constituted and controlled in pursuance of this Act.

3. (1) The Minister shall pay any sums appropriated by Capital account of 10 Parliament for that purpose into the capital account of the said fund. fund.

(2) The Minister shall pay any sums appropriated by Parliament for that purpose into the current account of the said fund.

(3) Any person may donate any sum of money to the fund, and such sum shall be carried to the capital account. 13 -
