Act No. , 1913.

An Act to sanction laying out an area of land and erecting thereon certain dwelling-houses under the provisions of the Housing Act, 1912; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto.

WHEREAS in accordance with the provisions of Preamble. the Public Works Act, 1912, the Legislative Assembly did, by resolution, declare that it was expedient to carry out a certain work, namely, the 5 laying out an area of land and erecting thereon certain dwelling-houses, under the provisions of the Housing 71935 170— Act

Act: And whereas, on the passing of the said resolution, a statutory duty was by the said Act imposed on the Minister to introduce a Bill into the said Assembly to sanction the carrying out of the said work: Be it

- 5 therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—
- 10 1. This Act may be cited as the "Daceyville Short title. Extension Act, 1913."

2. The carrying out of the said work (more par-work ticularly described in the Schedule to this Act) is hereby ^{sanctioned.} sanctioned.

15 3. The cost of carrying out the said work, estimated Cost of work at one hundred and fifty thousand pounds, shall be and how defrayed from the Housing Fund constituted by the Housing Act, 1912, and shall not under any circumstances exceed the estimated cost by more than ten per 20 centum.

SCHEDULE.

THE work consists of a further extension of the model suburb situated within the municipalities of Mascot and Botany, within the county of Cumberland, and known as "Daceyville" or "The Dacey Garden 25 Suburb," and includes the erection of dwellings and shops, together with the construction of the roads and such levelling and other works as may be necessary in connection therewith.
