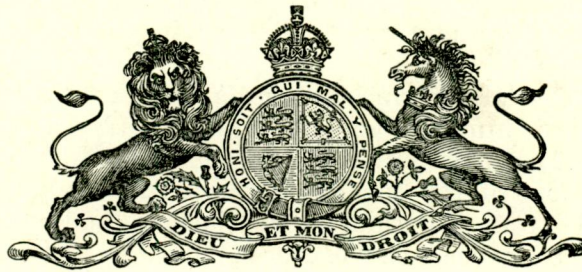

GEORGI V REGIS.

Act No. 63, 1912.

An Act to sanction the carrying out of a scheme of Sewerage for the Municipality of Dubbo; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Assented to, 20th December, 1912.]

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the Public Preamble. Works Act, 1900, the Legislative Assembly did, by resolution, declare that it was expedient to carry out a certain work, namely, the carrying out of a scheme of sewerage for the municipality of Dubbo; And whereas, on the passing of the said resolution, a statutory duty was by the said Act imposed on the Secretary for Public Works to introduce a Bill into the said Assembly to sanction the carrying out of the said work: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Dubbo Sewerage Act, Short title. 1912."

Dubbo Sewerage.

Work sanctioned.

2. The carrying out of the work, more particularly described in the Schedule to this Act, is hereby sanctioned, and the Secretary for Public Works, or the member of the Executive Council for the time being performing the duties of the said Secretary, is hereby authorised to undertake and carry out the said work subject to the provisions of this Act, and for that purpose shall be and shall have the powers and duties of a Constructing Authority within the meaning of the Public Works Act, 1900.

Plan of work.

3. The plan of the said work is the plan marked "Town of Dubbo, showing Sewerage Scheme" signed by the Secretary for Public Works, and countersigned by the Engineer in Charge of Water Conservation and Drainage, and deposited in the public office of the said Secretary.

Cost, and how defrayed.

4. The cost of carrying out the said work, estimated at thirty-five thousand eight hundred pounds, may be defrayed from such loan votes as are now, or may hereafter be, applicable to that purpose, or from appropriations of the Public Works Fund, or partly from such votes and partly from the said appropriations, and shall not, under any circumstances, exceed the estimated cost by more than ten per centum.

SCHEDULE.

THE construction of sewers, treatment works, pumping-station, rising main, and all works incidental thereto necessary for the sewerage of the town of Dubbo.

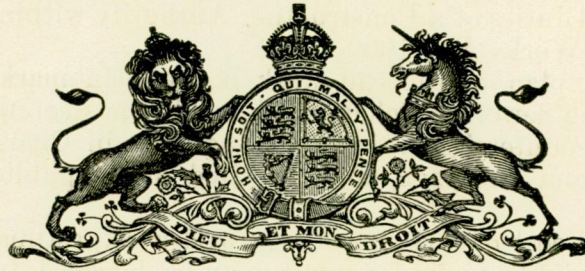
