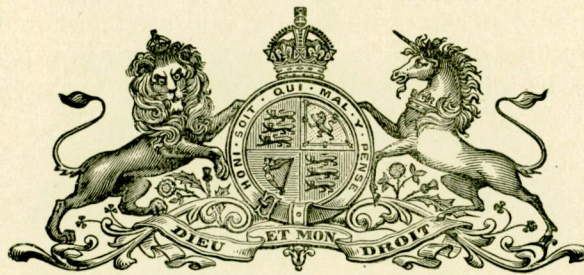

GEORGI V REGIS.

Act No. 41, 1910.

An Act to sanction the erection of a Hospital for the Insane at Orange; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Assented to, 28th December, 1910.]

WHEREAS in accordance with the provisions of the Public Works Act, 1900, the Legislative Assembly did, by resolution, declare that it was expedient to carry out a certain work, namely, the erection of a Hospital for the Insane at Orange: And whereas on the passing of the said resolution, a statutory duty was by the said Act imposed on the Secretary for Public Works to introduce a Bill into the said Assembly to sanction the carrying out of the said work: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Orange Hospital for Insane Act, 1910."

2. The works described in the Schedule to this Act are hereby sanctioned; and the carrying out of the same by the Secretary for Public Works, or the member of the Executive Council for the time being performing the duties of the said Secretary is hereby authorised, subject to the provisions of this Act, and for that purpose he shall be, and shall have the powers and duties of, a Constructing Authority within the meaning of the Public Works Act, 1900.

Plan of work.

3. The plan of the said work is the plan marked "Hospital for Insane, Orange," signed by the Secretary for Public Works, and countersigned by the Government Architect and deposited in the public office of the said Secretary.

Cost, how to be defrayed.

4. The cost of carrying out the said work, estimated at seventy-six thousand pounds, shall be defrayed from appropriations of the Public Works Fund, and shall not under any circumstances exceed the estimated cost by more than ten per centum.

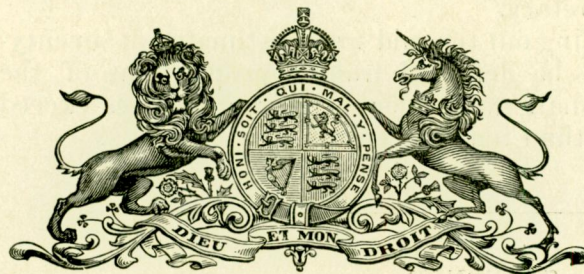
