# GEORGII V REGIS.

Act No. 38, 1910.

An Act to sanction the carrying out of a scheme of Sewerage for the Municipality of Orange; and for purposes consequent thereupon or incidental thereto. [Assented to, 28th December, 1910.]

WHEREAS in accordance with the provisions of the Public Preamble. Works Act, 1900, the Legislative Assembly did by resolution declare that it was expedient to carry out a certain work, namely, the carrying out of a scheme of Sewerage for the Municipality of Orange: And whereas, on the passing of the said resolution, a statutory duty was by the said Act imposed on the Secretary for Public Works to introduce a Bill into the said Assembly to sanction the carrying out of the said work: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Orange Sewerage Act, Short title. 1910."

### Orange Sewerage.

Work sanctioned.

2. The carrying out of the works, more particularly described in the Schedule to this Act, is hereby sanctioned, and the Secretary for Public Works, or the Member of the Executive Council for the time being performing the duties of the said Secretary, is hereby authorised to undertake and carry out the said works, subject to the provisions of this Act, and for that purpose shall be and shall have the powers and duties of a Constructing Authority within the meaning of the Public Works Act, 1900.

Plan of work.

3. The plan of the said works is the plan marked "Orange Sewerage Works," signed by the Secretary for Public Works, and countersigned by the Chief Engineer for Irrigation and Drainage, and deposited in the public office of the said Secretary.

Cost, and how defrayed.

4. The cost of carrying out the said works, estimated at twenty-seven thousand five hundred pounds, may be defrayed from such Loan Votes as are now, or may hereafter be, applicable to that purpose, and shall not, under any circumstances exceed the estimated cost by more than ten per centum.

#### SCHEDULE.

The construction of 15 miles 47 chains, more or less, of main and reticulating sewers, varying in size from 6 to 15 inches in diameter, together with manholes, junctions, gullies, ventilating shafts and pipes, penstocks, intercepting and flushing chambers, and all works incidental thereto and necessary for the proper completion thereof. The construction of works for the bacteriological treatment of sewage near Blackman's Swamp Creek.

The works above described are subject to such deviations and modifications, omissions, or extensions, as may hereafter be deemed necessary by the Constructing Authority.
