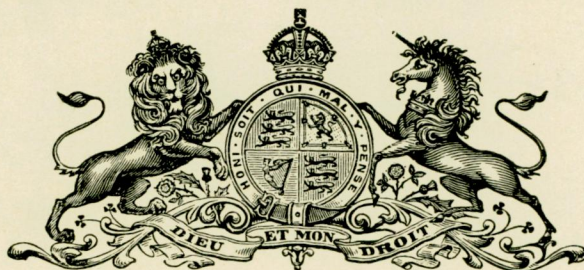

Act No. 19, 1912.

An Act to amend the Constitution Act, 1902, with regard to the allowances to members of the Legislative Assembly; and for other purposes. [Assented to, 17th September, 1912.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Parliamentary Representatives Allowance Act, 1912." Short title.

2. Section twenty-eight of the Constitution Act, 1902, as amended by the Parliamentary Elections Act, 1906, is amended— as Allowance to be £500 per annum.

(a) by the substitution of the words "five hundred" for the words "three hundred";

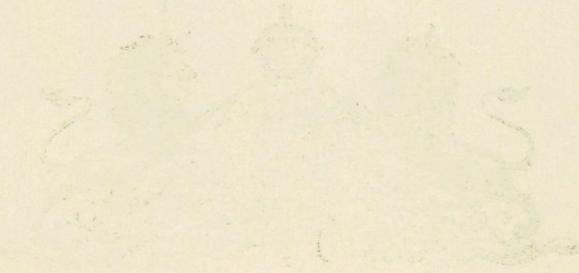
(b) by the addition of the following paragraph to follow the first paragraph:—

"The Leader of the Opposition shall be entitled to receive an additional allowance of two hundred and fifty pounds per annum"; and

(c) by the addition at the end of the section of the following paragraph:—

"All moneys accruing due to any member under this Act, not drawn within seven days after the close of any Parliament, either by dissolution or by effluxion of time, shall revert to the Treasury."

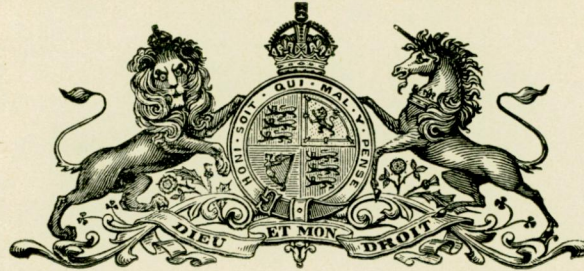
