Act No. 10, 1912.

An Act to sanction the erection of new offices for the Department of Public Instruction ; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Assented to, 4th April, 1912.]

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the Public Works Act, 1900, the Legislative Assembly did, by resolution, declare that it was expedient to carry out a certain work, namely, the erection of new offices for the Department of Public Instruction ; And whereas on the passing of the said resolution, a statutory duty was by the said Act imposed on the Secretary for Public Works to introduce a Bill into the said Assembly to sanction the carrying out of the said work : Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Public Instruction Offices Act, 1912."

Public Instruction Offices.

Work sanctioned.

2. The carrying out of the works, more particularly described in the Schedule to this Act, is hereby sanctioned; and the Secretary for Public Works, or the member of the Executive Council for the time being performing the duties of the said Secretary, is hereby authorised to undertake and carry out the said works, subject to the provisions of this Act, and for that purpose shall be and shall have the powers and duties of a Constructing Authority within the meaning of the Public Works Act, 1900.

Plan of work.

3. The plan of the said works is the plan marked "Department of Public Instruction New Offices," signed by the Secretary for Public Works, and countersigned by the Acting Director of Public Works, and deposited in the public office of the said Secretary.

Cost, and how to be defrayed.

4. The cost of carrying out the said works, estimated at sixty-five thousand one hundred and fifty pounds, may be defrayed from such loan votes as are now, or may hereafter be, applicable to that purpose, or from appropriations of the Public Works Fund, or partly from such votes and partly from the said appropriations, and shall not, under any circumstances, exceed the estimated cost by more than ten per centum.

THE site of the proposed buildings consist of a block of land with frontages to Bridge-street, Loftus-street, Young-street, and Bent-street, Sydney.

The buildings will consist of basement, ground floor, first, second, third, fourth, and fifth floors. The external design to be of stone and the general design of brick and steel with re-inforced concrete floors, with few ornamental features.

The construction of the buildings throughout is of a fire-proof character.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Public Instruction Offices Short title.
Act, 1912." **2.**
