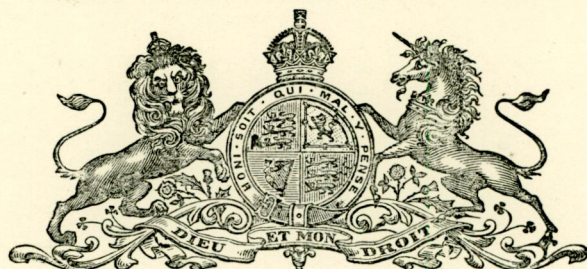

An Act to amend the Senators' Elections Act, 1903 ; and for other purposes. [Assented to, 20th December, 1912.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 1.** This Act may be cited as the "Senators' Elections (Amendment) Act, 1912." Short title.
- 2.** Subsection two of section four of the Senators' Elections Act, 1903, is amended by inserting at the end of the subsection the words "but so that the date so fixed shall fall on a Saturday." Polling day to be a Saturday.
- 3.** Subsection three of the same section is amended by omitting "sixty" and inserting the word "ninety." Extension of date for return of writ.
- 4.** Section eight of the same Act is amended by omitting "seven o'clock" and inserting the words "eight o'clock." Extension of time for closing poll.
