#### GEORGII V REGIS.

### Act No. 5, 1911.

An Act to constitute special deposit accounts in the Treasury for the receipt and payment of moneys relating to certain Government undertakings and institutions; to amend the Constitution Act, 1902; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Assented to, 12th July, 1911.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Special Deposits Accounts short title and

Act, 1911."

This Act shall commence on a day to be proclaimed by the Governor in the Gazette.

#### Special Deposits Accounts.

Constitution of special deposit accounts.

2. (1) The Colonial Treasurer may cause special deposit accounts to be opened in the Treasury to which shall be paid—

(a) the proceeds of the sale of produce, stock, or articles by any such Government farm, Government agricultural college, or Government institution as he may specify by notification in the Gazette; and

(b) all moneys received in connection with such accommodation houses for tourists carried on by the Government and such Government undertakings in connection with tourist resorts as he may specify by notification in the Gazette.

(2) There shall be paid out of any such account any expenditure of or in relation to any such farm, college, or accommodation house or tourist resort, and any class of expenditure of any such Government institution specified by the Colonial Treasurer by notification in the Gazette.

(3) The said Treasurer may vary or rescind any notification made under this section.

3. The Colonial Treasurer may cause the whole or any portion of the moneys which are a credit of a special deposit account in the Treasury in relation to any such farm, college, institution, accommodation house, or tourist resort, to be carried to any special deposit accounts opened under this Act, or to be distributed among any such special deposit accounts, and may cause any such first-mentioned accounts to be closed.

4. There shall, as soon as practicable after the thirtieth day of June in each year, be laid before each House of Parliament a statement of the payments into and out of each special account opened under this Act during the twelve months ending on the said day, arranged under suitable headings.
