**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

**1.** This Act may be cited as the "Sydney Corporation (Amendment) Act, 1911." Short title.

**2.** Section fifty of the Sydney Corporation Act, 1902, is amended by omitting subsection three and by inserting in lieu thereof the following:— Amendment of s. 50 of Sydney Corporation Act, 1902.

If the Lord Mayor is absent or is about to be absent from New South Wales, or is absent from his office by reason of illness or otherwise, the council may appoint an alderman as deputy; and during such absence of the Lord Mayor, such deputy shall perform all the duties and exercise all the powers imposed or conferred on the Lord Mayor, and shall preside at all meetings of the council at which he is present.

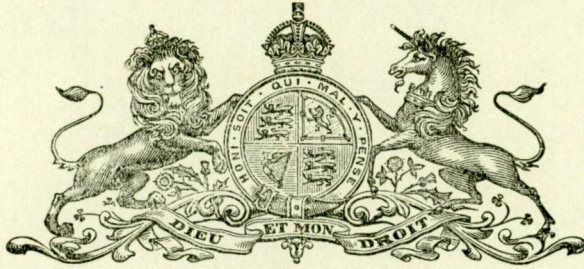

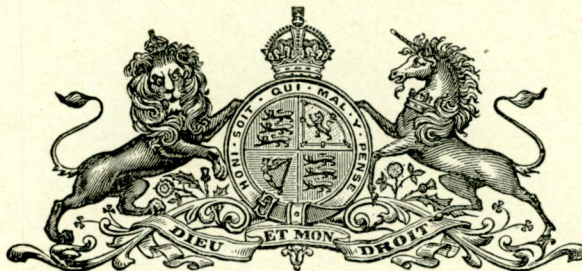

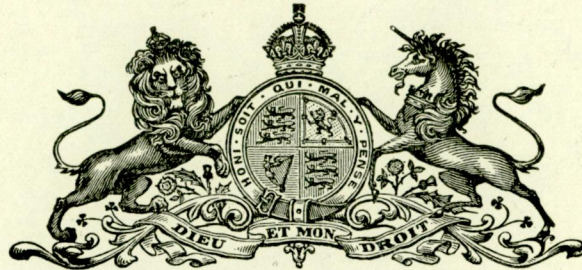

An Act to provide for the appointment of a deputy having the absence of the Lord Mayor, and for other purposes.  
Enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Deputy Mayor (Absence) Act, 1881.

2. Whenever any of the Mayor's Corporation, but 1881, is absent from his office, or is absent from his office by reason of illness or otherwise, the Council may appoint an alderman as deputy; and during the absence of the Lord Mayor, the deputy shall perform all the duties and exercise all the powers imposed or conferred on the Lord Mayor, and shall preside at all meetings of the Council at which he is present.

3. If the Lord Mayor is absent or is absent from his office for more than three days, or is absent from his office by reason of illness or otherwise, the Council may appoint an alderman as deputy; and during the absence of the Lord Mayor, the deputy shall perform all the duties and exercise all the powers imposed or conferred on the Lord Mayor, and shall preside at all meetings of the Council at which he is present.
