





5. The said Treasurer shall in his Accounts from Treasurer time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums shall be allowed of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant credit for or order in writing as aforesaid, and the receipts of moneys pail the respective persons to whom the same are so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said Accounts for any such sums as may be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

6. This Act may be cited as the "Appropriation short title. Act, 1915."
