Act No. , 1914.

An Act to enable auctioneers to sell wool, skins, and hides after sunset; to amend the Auctioneers' Licensing Act, 1898, and the Acts relating to early closing.

B^E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of 5 the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Auctioneers' Short title. Licensing (Amendment) Act, 1914." 219—21.

Auctioneers' Licensing (Amendment).

2. Section eighteen of the Auctioneers' Licensing Permits to Act, 1898, is amended by the addition of the following sell wool, proviso:—

and tallow at any time.

"Provided that a court of petty sessions may, on ^{any time.} application, grant a permit to an auctioneer, who holds an auctioneer's license under this Act, to put up to sale or sell after sunset, any wool, skins, hides, or tallow, notwithstanding anything contained in the Acts relating to early closing.

"Such permit may be revoked at any time by the court issuing it, but if not revoked shall be in force during the currency of the auctioneer's license.

"It shall apply only to the auctioneer named therein, and be available only in the police district wherein it was issued."
