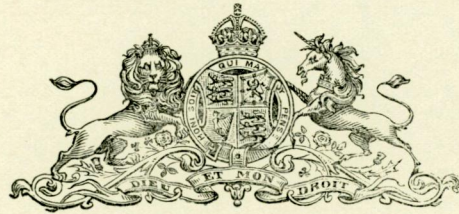

Any Stock or Treasury Bills of the Commonwealth of Australia sold or issued under the War Loan Act (No. 1), 1915, of the said Commonwealth, are hereby declared to be for all purposes Government Securities; and all corporations and other persons whatsoever shall have power to invest in the purchase of such Stock and Treasury Bills any property held by them, whether as trustees or otherwise, which they are not expressly forbidden to invest in Government Stock or Securities, without on that account being liable for a breach of trust and without incurring any liability whatsoever, provided that such investment is in other respects reasonable and proper.

That the Government Securities Act, 1915, be amended  
in the following manner:  
Section 10 of the said Act is hereby amended  
so that it shall read as follows:  
"10. The Treasurer is hereby authorized to invest  
any moneys which may be available for investment  
in Government Securities, and to purchase or  
sell any such securities, and to do all such  
acts and things as may be necessary or  
expedient for the purposes of this section."  
Section 11 of the said Act is hereby amended  
so that it shall read as follows:  
"11. The Treasurer is hereby authorized to  
invest any moneys which may be available for  
investment in Government Securities, and to
