GEORGII V REGIS.

Act No. 45, 1916.

An Act to provide that officers in the public service of New South Wales may be nominated and elected to the Legislative Assembly and that when so elected any such officer shall resign his position in the said service; to amend the Constitution Act, 1902; and for other purposes. [Assented to, 4th October, 1916.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Constitution Short title.
(Public Service) Amendment Act, 1916." **2.**

I have examined this Bill, and find it to correspond in all respects with the Bill as finally passed by both Houses.

2. (1) Nothing in section twenty-six of the Constitu-
tion Act, 1902, shall be deemed to have extended or

3. Any officer in the said public service who is con-
testing a Parliamentary election shall not be entitled to
any salary during his absence from duty owing to such
contest :

Provided that the section shall in no way affect his
right to leave of absence or salary under the Acts and
regulations relating to the public service.
