BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

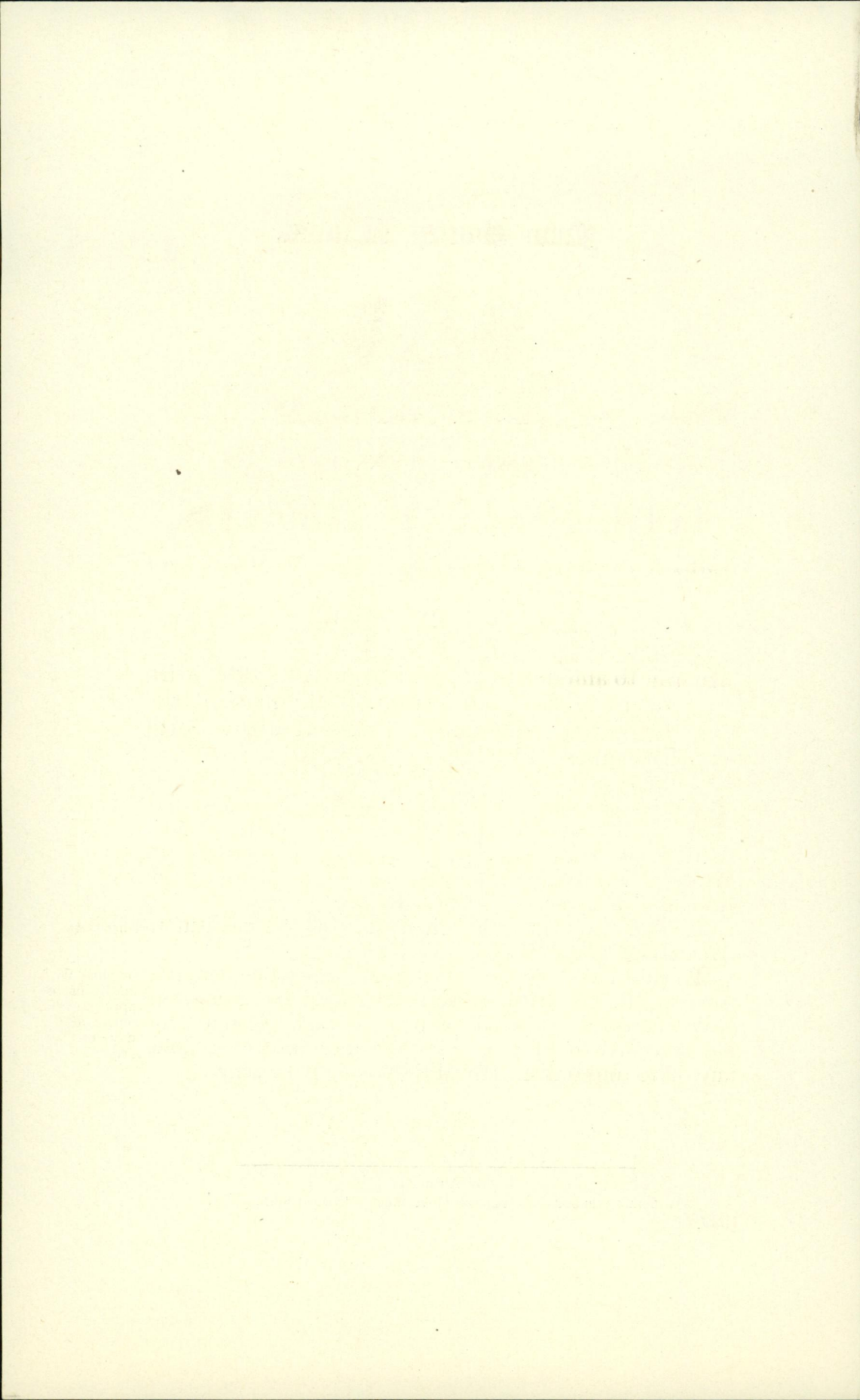
1. This Act may be cited as the "Constitution Amendment Act, 1914." Short title.

2. Nothing in section twenty-six or section twenty-seven of the Constitution Act, 1902, shall be deemed to have extended or shall extend to any person who has accepted or held or may hereafter accept or hold any office of profit in His Majesty's navy or army. Sections 26 and 27 not to apply to officers of navy or army.

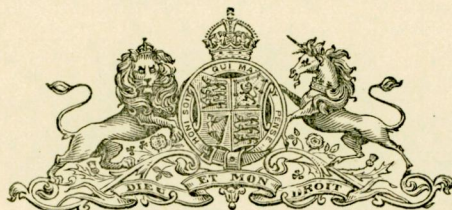
