Act No. 70, 1916.

An Act to fix the salaries of the Railway Commissioners, and to amend the Government Railways Act, 1912. [Assented to, 11th December, 1916.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Government Railways (Further Amendment) Act, 1916." Short title.

2. The following section is inserted next after section eight of the Government Railways Act, 1912 :—

9. The Commissioners shall respectively receive salaries not exceeding the following yearly rates :—

The Chief Railway Commissioner for New South Wales, three thousand pounds.

The Assistant Railway Commissioner for New South Wales appointed as deputy of the said Chief Railway Commissioner, two thousand six hundred pounds.

Each of the other two Assistant Railway Commissioners for New South Wales, one thousand eight hundred pounds.

Such salaries are hereby charged upon the Consolidated Revenue Fund, and such fund to the extent required for the payment of such salaries is hereby permanently appropriated.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty I assent to this Act.
