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Act No. 20, 1916.

An Act to sanction the construction of a dam on the Chichester River and other works in connection with the Hunter district water supply; to authorise the construction and use of certain works under, over, and along public roads; and for purposes consequent thereon and incidental thereto. [Assented to, 19th April, 1916.]

WHEREAS [in accordance with the provisions of Preamble. the Public Works Act, 1912, the Legislative Assembly did, by resolution, declare that it was expedient to carry out a certain work, namely, the carrying out of a scheme to augment the Hunter district water supply by the construction of a dam on the Chichester

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Chichester River : And whereas, on the passing of the said resolution, a statutory duty was by the said Act imposed on the Minister for Public Works to introduce a Bill into the said Assembly to sanction the carrying out the said work : Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

**1.** This Act may be cited as the "Hunter District Water Supply (Chichester Dam) Act, 1916."

Works sanctioned.

**2.** The carrying out of the work (more particularly described in the Schedule to this Act) is hereby sanctioned ; and the Minister for Public Works, or the member of the Executive Council for the time being performing the duties of the said Minister, is hereby authorised to undertake and carry out the said work, subject to the provisions of this Act, and for that purpose shall be, and shall have the powers of a Constructing Authority within the meaning of the Public Works Act, 1912.

ARTICLE I

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2.

1. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State.

2. No Person shall be a Representative who shall not, when elected, have seven Years Residence in this Country, and who, when elected, shall not, when he takes the Oath or Affirmation, have seven Years Residence in that State in which he shall be chosen.

3. The Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State.

4. The House may determine the Rules of its Proceedings, and may punish its Members for Disobedience of its Orders, for Unbecoming Conduct, and for Absence without Leave, and may, by a two thirds Vote, expel a Member for Breach of the Oath or Affirmation.

5. The House of Representatives shall be assembled in the City of New York, but they may, by a two thirds Vote, determine to meet in any other Place within the United States, and may, by a two thirds Vote, adjourn from Place to Place, and may, by a two thirds Vote, change the Day of the Meeting.

6. The House of Representatives shall have the sole Power of Impeachment.

7. The House of Representatives shall be the Judge of the Elections, Returns and Qualifications of its Members, and may determine the Rules of their Proceedings, and may punish its Members for Disobedience of its Orders, for Unbecoming Conduct, and for Absence without Leave, and may, by a two thirds Vote, expel a Member for Breach of the Oath or Affirmation.

8. The House of Representatives shall have the sole Power of Impeachment.
