Act No. , 1915.

An Act to alter the closing time of licensed premises and clubs under the Liquor Act, 1912, from eleven o'clock to ~~ten~~ nine o'clock at night; to alter the opening time for such premises; to make other provisions with respect to ~~opening and closing times and~~ the sale of liquor on Christmas Day and Good Friday; to fix the hours for the sale and supply of liquor in the Parliamentary Refreshment Room, and for those purposes to amend the said Act; and to amend the law relating to early closing, and for other purposes of and incidental to the granting of publican's licenses.

*Liquor Amendment.*

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Liquor Amendment Act, 1915." Short title.
2. Section fifty-seven, subsection one, paragraph-(b) of the Liquor Act, 1912, is amended by omitting all the paragraph after the words "Christmas Day" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "except between the hours of half-past seven and nine in the morning, and of half-past twelve and two in the afternoon, and of half-past eight and ten at night." of the Liquor Act, 1912, Hours for sale of liquor on Good Fridays and Christmas Days.
3. Paragraph (d) of the same subsection is amended by omitting the words "six" and "eleven" and substituting therefor the words "eight" and "~~ten~~" "nine" respectively. Hours during which licensed premises may be kept open.
4. Notwithstanding the provisions of section thirteen of the said Act the steward of the Parliamentary Refreshment Room shall not sell or supply liquor except between the hours of eight in the morning and ~~ten~~ nine at night. Parliamentary refreshment room.
- Any such steward who offends against the provisions of this section shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.
5. (1) Section six of the Early Closing Act, 1899, is amended by adding at the end of the provision relating to the closing time for shops mentioned in Part III of Schedule One the following proviso:— Amendments of the Early Closing Act, 1899, s. 6.
  - 35 "Provided that the closing time for public-houses, hotels, and wine shops shall be ~~ten~~ nine o'clock on each week-day."
  - (2) Section seven of the same Act is amended by adding after the words "Provided that" the following words: "except in the case of public-houses, hotels, and wine shops".

**6.** Section nine, subsection four, of the Liquor Act, 1912, is amended in line twenty-one, after the word "store," by inserting the following words:—"Then unless it also appear that such portion has no direct  
5 internal communication with the said licensed premises and that such portion is expressly excluded from the said license." And further by inserting after the word "premises" in line twenty-two the following words:  
"included in the said section"

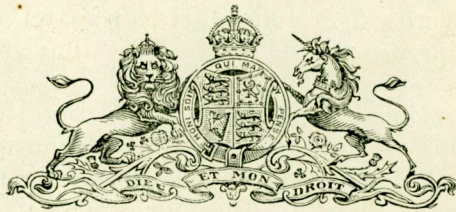
