A BILL

To make other provision for the Local Government of certain lands within the municipality of Mascot ; to amend the Acts relating to Local Government ; and for other purposes.

[MR. J. D. FITZGERALD ;—30 *August*, 1916.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Mascot Municipality (Housing Board) Act, 1916." Short title.

2. Except as hereinafter in this Act provided, the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1906, and any Act amending or consolidating it shall not apply—

- (a) to any land within the municipality of Mascot which was appropriated by Gazette notice of the twenty-fifth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, under and for the purposes of the Housing Act, 1912; or
- (b) to any land within the said municipality vested in His Majesty, or in any person in trust for His Majesty, including land resumed for any purpose whatsoever which may hereafter be appropriated under and for the purposes of the Housing Act, 1912.

3. The Governor by proclamation published in the Gazette may declare that the Housing Board constituted by the Housing Act, 1912, shall have, with respect to all or any of the land mentioned in the last preceding section, such of the powers, authorities, and duties of a council under the Local Government Act, 1906, and any Act amending or consolidating it, and any regulations and ordinances thereunder as are in such proclamation mentioned or referred to, and may declare that any specified provisions of the said Acts, regulations, and ordinances as in his opinion are necessary or desirable for the purpose of the exercise of such powers and authorities or the discharge of such duties shall, mutatis mutandis, be in force with respect to such land. The Governor may in like manner amend or repeal any such proclamation.

Any such proclamation shall have the force of law.
