Act No. 44, 1915.

An Act to sanction the construction of a line of railway from Mirool to Hillston; to provide for the use of the said line by the Constructing Authority, or by persons authorised by him; to amend the Public Works Act, 1912; and for purposes consequent thereon and incidental thereto. [Assented to, 21st December, 1915.]

WHEREAS in accordance with the provisions of Preamble. the Public Works Act, 1912, the Legislative Assembly did by resolution declare that it was expedient to carry out a certain work, namely, the construction of a line of railway from Mirool to Hillston: And whereas, on the passing of the said resolution,

I have examined this Bill, and find it to correspond in all respects with the Bill as finally passed by both Houses.

resolution, a statutory duty was by the said Act imposed on the Minister to introduce a Bill into the said Assembly to sanction the carrying out of the said work : Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :---

1. This Act may be cited as the "Mirool to Hillston

Work sanctioned. Railway Act, 1915.'

The plan.

Cost, and how to be defrayed.

Line may be constructed on road. Fencing. 2. The carrying out of the work (more particularly described in the Schedule to this Act) is hereby sanctioned, and the Minister for Public Works, or the member of the Executive Council for the time being performing the duties of the said Minister, is hereby authorised to undertake and carry out the said work, subject to the provisions of this Act, and for that purpose shall be and shall have the powers of a Constructing Authority within the meaning of the Public Works Act, 1912.

3. The plan of the said work is the plan marked "Mirool to Hillston," signed by the Minister for Public Works and countersigned by the Chief Engineer for Railway and Tramway Construction, and deposited in the public office of the said Minister.

4. The cost of carrying out the said work, estimated at two hundred and thirty thousand pounds (exclusive of land resumptions) may be defrayed from such Loan Votes as are now or may hereafter be applicable to the purpose, or from appropriations of the Public Works Fund, or partly from such votes and partly from such appropriations, and shall not, under any circumstances, exceed the estimated cost by more than ten per centum.

5. The said line of railway may be constructed on or along or by the side of any public road or highway.

6. Notwithstanding the provisions of section ninetyone of the Public Works Act, 1912, the Constructing Authority shall not be compelled, nor shall it be the duty of the said authority to make or maintain any fence along the said line of railway for the accommodation of any person or for any purpose whatsoever; but the said authority

authority may, in his discretion, make and maintain such fences in connection with the said line of railway as he may think fit.

7. The Constructing Authority and any person Constructing authorised by him may use the said line, or any part Authority may use line. thereof, before it is transferred to the Chief Commissioner for Railways and Tramways, and for that purpose may run thereon any carriages or waggons propelled or drawn by any motive power.

SCHEDULE.

Mirool to Hillston Railway.

THIS railway commences at the end of the authorised line from Barellan to Mirool at 386 miles 46 chains from Sydney, and proceeds in a north-westerly direction to about 419 miles, and about 16 miles northeast of the township of Gunbar; thence the line bears more northerly to 445 miles; thence it proceeds nearly due north to Hillston, where the line terminates at the southern boundary of the private township, at 448 miles 66 chains from Sydney, being a total distance of 62 miles 14 chains, and subject to such deviations and modifications as may be considered desirable by the Constructing Authority.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty I assent to this Act.
