BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Probate Duties Short title. War Exemption Act, 1915." 2.

Exemption of certain estates.

The provisions of Part III of the Stamp Duties Act, 1898, as amended by Part III of the Stamp Duties (Amendment) Act, 1904, and by Part III of the Stamp Duties (Amendment) Act, 1914, and the provisions of the Companies (Death Duties) Act, 1901, shall not apply or be deemed to have applied to the estate of any person who during the present war, or within one year after its termination, has died or may hereafter die on active service or as a result of injury received or diseases contracted on active service with the Military or Naval Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia or of any part of the King's Dominions, or any estate the subject of any settlement, trust, disposition, conveyance, transfer, vesting, purchase, investment, or gift made or caused to be made by any person so dying.
