Act No. 23, 1915.

An Act to amend the Stock Diseases (Tick) Act, 1901; and to provide for the appointment of inspectors by the Minister. [Assented to, 6th September, 1915.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Stock Diseases Short title. (Tick) Amendment Act, 1915." **2.**

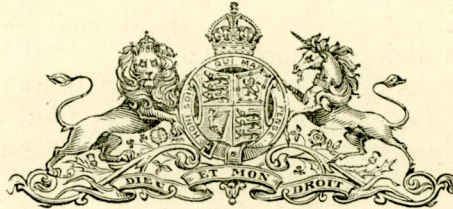
