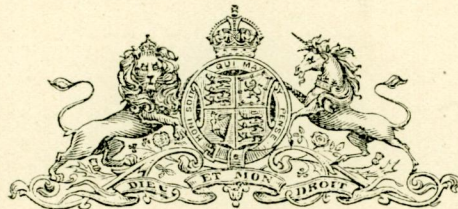

Act No. 61, 1915.

An Act to provide for the election of the Lord Mayor of the City of Sydney; and to amend the Sydney Corporation Act, 1902. [Assented to, 22nd December, 1915.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Sydney Corporation Short title.
(Election of Mayor) Act, 1915."

It shall be construed with the Sydney Corporation Act, 1902.

2. If the aldermen of the City of Sydney fail to elect a Lord Mayor on or before the thirtieth day of December in any year the Governor may appoint some member of the council to be Lord Mayor. Election of Lord Mayor.

Where at a meeting of aldermen of the City of Sydney, held before or after the commencement of this Act, in the month of December of any year, for the election of the Lord Mayor of the said city for the forthcoming year the voting is equal for any two candidates who each receive more votes than any other candidate, the Lord Mayor in office, whether he is an alderman of the said city or not, may attend at such meeting or at any adjournment thereof or at any meeting of aldermen of the said city convened by him for the purpose and give a casting vote for one of such candidates, who shall thereupon be the Lord Mayor of the said city for the forthcoming year. But if such Lord Mayor does not on or before the thirty-first day of the said month of December give such casting vote, the one of such candidates who has served the longer term as alderman of the said city shall be Lord Mayor of the said city for the forthcoming year. 5 10 15

Where at a meeting of aldermen of the City of Sydney, held before or after the commencement of this Act, in the month of December of any year, for the election of the Lord Mayor of the said city for the forthcoming year the voting is equal for any two candidates 5 who each receive more votes than any other candidate, the Lord Mayor in office, whether he is an alderman of the said city or not, may attend at such meeting or at any adjournment thereof or at any meeting of aldermen of the said city convened by him for the 10 purpose and give a casting vote for one of such candidates, who shall thereupon be the Lord Mayor of the said city for the forthcoming year. But if such Lord Mayor does not on or before the thirty-first day of the said month of December give such casting vote, the one 15 of such candidates who has served the longer term as alderman of the said city shall be Lord Mayor of the said city for the forthcoming year.
