## A BILL

To provide authority for females to adopt male attire, and to assume a male Christian or first-name.

[Mr. Creed;—31 August, 1916.]

WHEREAS there are callings that might be followed Preamble. by females as a means of earning their livelihood which they are prevented by the disabilities imposed or caused by the use of female attire from adopting: Be it 5 therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

10 1. This Act may be cited as the "Females Attire short title. Relief Act, 1916."

2. A female above the age of sixteen years may apply Police to a stipendary or police magistrate, who is hereby em-magistrate may grant powered to grant her an authority to wear male attire authority, &c.

- 15 and also to adopt a male christian or first-name in place of her feminine attire and name, and such stipendiary or police magistrate shall, on complying with such request, furnish such person with a certificate to that effect.
- **3.** In the event of the stipendary or police magistrate Appeal declining to consent to such request the applicant shall be entitled to appeal to a judge of the district court, who may order such certificate to be issued.

4. The granting of a certificate shall free any female Effect of 25 from any disability in regard to the wearing of male certificate. dress.
