FACS and its partners have been working intensively to engage with people sleeping rough at Martin Place and offer them support. FACS Housing is currently attending Martin Place three times a week offering housing assistance to clients, supporting them to make housing applications, providing temporary accommodation and making referrals to other support services.

FACS and its partner agencies have also implemented pop-up housing offices in key locations in the Sydney CBD, including Martin Place, Belmore Park, Wentworth Park, Town Hall, Central Station and Woolloomooloo.

This approach brings housing services to the places where people are sleeping rough. It allows people to engage with FACS Housing staff and specialist homelessness services.

The Government recently announced that as part of the 2017-18 Budget, the Government will expand transitional housing and supports for rough sleepers.

\$20 million in funding over four years will provide an additional 120 properties and support packages. A minimum of 255 clients are expected to be assisted over a four-year period

The Commonwealth Government recently extended the expiring National Partnership Agreement on Homelessness (NPAH) for a further 12 months, from 1 July 2017 to 30 June 2018. The Government will continue to work with the Commonwealth Government to negotiate a longer term policy and funding framework for housing and homelessness.
